Scattered throughout the [Okanagan Valley](#) on cliffs and in caves are hundreds of drawings of animals and people known as pictographs. These are evidence of a culture that has flourished in the Okanagan Valley for thousands of years. The [Osoyoos Indian Band](#) is one of seven Okanagan Nations and NK'MIP, pronounced "in-Ka-meep", meaning "bottomland", is a location at the southern end of the Osoyoos Reservation.

Aboriginal Culture and Spirituality

Who is Coyote and what can I learn from him? A trickster who may be the bridge between the human world and the animal world, Coyote has some lessons for all of us.

There is a growing interest in aboriginal culture and spirituality, as we reflect on traditions and ancient wisdom. The new Nk'MIP Desert Cultural Centre tells some of these stories of Canada's only desert, shares the challenges and triumphs of Okanagan People, and offers insight into a unique natural environment.

The state-of-the-art interpretive centre is an architectural marvel sensitively constructed into a hillside. Extensive indoor and outdoor exhibit galleries create a fun, interactive learning environment with hands-on displays, education stations and two multi-media theatre experiences. Learning programs, rattlesnake tagging, pictographs and more.



Family Adventures

Osoyoos has grown up too, offering much more than a beach vacation (not that beach holidays are so bad!). Snowbirds are retired and semi-retired people, usually from Canada's prairies, who have discovered that winter in Osoyoos isn't really winter as the rest of us know it. Relatively warm and dry weather with a great sense of community makes it a fantastic place to wait out the season.

While the snowbirds take in the wineries and a game of winter-golf, they tend to form their own communities and organize their own events. From water-aerobics to craft days to community dances, these folks love to keep busy. Backgrounder: Osoyoos Indian Band

The Osoyoos Indian Band has a strong vision for its future and for the region. The vision to create a spectacular resort with golf, winery, accommodation, spa, and cultural centre has come together through strategic partnerships and strong leadership.



Land acquisition and further business expansion is also part of the Band's long range plans and nearing completion is a \$100 million destination resort known at NK'MIP. Anchoring this multi-million dollar resort which features golfing, a winery, accommodation and spa is the \$9 million NK'MIP Desert Cultural Centre. The Osoyoos Indian Band reserve inhabits some of the last large tracts of desert lands left in Canada where approximately 450 members live.

Under the direction of a professional Board of Advisors, the Osoyoos Indian Band Development Corporation is expanding into new areas of investment such as their recent investment in Spirit Ridge Vineyard Resort Inc. and the Mt. Baldy Ski Resort, in addition to the NK'MIP Desert Cultural Centre, NK'MIP RV Park and NK'MIP Cellars.

"The Band does not owe its membership dependency," said Chief Louie, "it owes them an opportunity and a chance to become independent." He further voices his fundamental belief that the success of Indian people is directly tied to their participation in the economy.

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Backgrounder: NK'MIP Cellars

NK'MIP Cellars is North America's first aboriginal owned and operated winery dedicated to crafting premium VQA wines. The winery site is one of the most attractive in the South Okanagan with outstanding views in a setting of natural beauty. Situated on a bench overlooking the shores of Lake Osoyoos and surrounded by vineyards, the site is adjacent to one of the last tracts of natural desert land.



The Band shares its history and traditions with those who visit the winery. Tour experiences at the winery are offered daily, as is the opportunity to sample NK'MIP Cellars' award winning wines. The architecture was designed and constructed to display native art and artifacts, and enhance the beauty and unique nature of the wild sage desert surroundings. The winery was designed by Penticton-based architect Robert Mackenzie, who has designed four other British Columbia wineries.

The symbol on the NK'MIP wines is inspired by pictographs found throughout the Okanagan Valley. The turtle pictograph reflects wisdom, vision and ingenuity, and is located upon the arrowhead (spear), a symbol of power and strength.

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Background: Sonora Dunes Golf Course

Osoyoos, home to Canada's only Arid Desert, enjoys hot summers with little precipitation and the mildest winter climate in Canada allowing Sonora Dunes to be accessible year round. Sonora Dunes is a non-membership 9-Hole, par 35-golf facility with challenging play, beautiful surroundings and affordable rates. After the game, relax at Sonora Dunes' casual and welcoming clubhouse, featuring covered patios and open deck areas overlooking Lake Osoyoos.

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Backgrounder: NK'MIP Desert Cultural Centre

The NK'MIP Desert Cultural Centre invites visitors to celebrate thousands of years of Okanagan First Nations habitation on desert lands. The Centre provides on-site tours – including a reconstructed traditional village, interpretive programs and interactive displays reflecting the rich heritage of the Okanagan people. The NK'MIP desert lands are one of Canada's three most endangered ecosystems and the home of many endangered plant & animal species.



The new \$9 Million facility opened in June of 2006, celebrating the theme of the "Lands, Legends and the People", and showcasing the significance of the Osoyoos Indian Band through historical time to the present. In addition to rattlesnake research, guided and self-guided hikes, the Centre presents the story of a First Nations people in the context of one of the most environmentally unique landscapes in Canada.

An exciting addition is the Chaptik Theatre, featuring the debut film "Coyote Spirit". This original movie shares the story of a modern-day girl that goes back to the "Res" (Reservation) for the summer and learns from her grandfather and the mythical "Coyote" about who she is and what it means to be Okanagan.

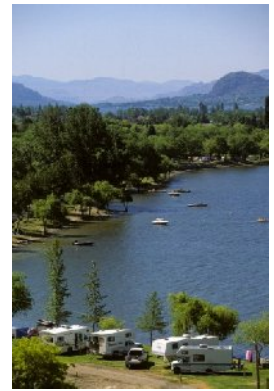
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Background: NK'MIP RV Park

NK'MIP Park has welcomed families to Osoyoos since 1982. It's not surprising that it is one of the region's most popular sites, considering its location on the shores of Lake Osoyoos, at the edge of the Sonora Desert, and just minutes from the town's main street.

Open year-round, NK'MIP RV Park offers over 320 sites with amenity levels ranging from simple tenting spots to full service RV stalls, complete with wireless internet access and a hotel-like telephone system. NK'MIP RV Park has an 8,020 sq ft clubhouse perfect for events or meetings, an indoor pool & hot tub (open Sept – June) and a patio perfect for group BBQ's. The NK'MIP Convenience Store offers snacks, an ATM and essential groceries for guests throughout NK'MIP Resort.



The most enjoyable part of NK'MIP RV Park is the sense of community and camaraderie. Visit any season, and you'll be welcomed by people who come back every year. Friendships form and great memories are shared. This is most apparent with the "snowbird" (semi-retired or retired travelers escaping the Prairie winters), who use the clubhouse for potlucks, craft sessions, and community dances.
